A covered forecourt leads to your own suite, where staff whisk away your baggage, bring your boarding pass, sort out passports and security and then whizz you to the plane in a limo. Other airports have been slow to catch on, so you need someone very well connected to magic you unseen out the other side.

Kruger National Park, South Africa

A four-suite lodge on a private reserve in the Kruger, so you're literally surrounded by paparazzi-eating lions. The More family, who run this place, are expert at squirrelling away celebrities for a very private safari.
